SCHOOL GUIDELINES REGARDING PTA COMMITTEE

General rules

1. DEFINITION & AIM OF THE PTA

- The function of PTA is not only to help/ support the school in the development of students but also to provide help/support in the improvement and development of the school.

2. DEFINITION OF KEYWORDS

- Association – All Parents, Teachers and employees of THE DEEPIKA PUBLIC SCHOOL
- Members – Any / All individuals who have been accepted and admitted by the Association.

3. PREAMBLE

We desire to sustain the promotion and continuity of sound, meaningful and qualitative education for the students of DEEPIKA PUBLIC SCHOOL we, the parents/guardians and teachers of the students hereby jointly and severally agree to constitute ourselves into an organization whose membership shall embrace all parents, guardians and teachers of registered pupils in DEEPIKA PUBLIC SCHOOL.

4. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The aims and objectives of the association shall be:

- To provide a platform for parents, guardians, and teachers of students of DEEPIKA PUBLIC SCHOOL

(MINUTES OF MEETING)

Impact of environmental pollution on students' health and well-being, explore ways to mitigate its effects and promote sustainability within the school community.

Key Discussions

Ms Meenakshi presented alarming statistics on the rise of respiratory issues, allergies and mental health concerns among children due to environmental pollution. Key factors discussed included:



1. Air pollution from vehicles and industrial activities
2. Water contamination from plastic waste and chemicals
3. Soil pollution from pesticides and herbicides

Implications for Students

- Respiratory problems and allergies
- Increased risk of cancer and neurological disorders
- Mental health concerns, such as anxiety and depression
- Impact on cognitive development and academic performance

Strategies to Curb Pollution

1. Reduce: Minimize single-use plastics, energy consumption and water waste
2. Reuse: Promote reusable bags, containers and water bottles
3. Recycle: Implement effective recycling programs
4. Educate: Integrate environmental education into school curricula
5. Community Involvement: Organize clean-up initiatives, tree-planting drives and awareness campaigns

Action Plan

1. Establish a school environmental committee
2. Conduct regular pollution audits
3. Develop sustainable practices policies
4. Collaborate with local organizations for environmental initiatives
5. Involve students in eco-friendly projects and competitions

Recommendations

1. Encourage carpooling, walking or cycling to school
2. Implement energy-efficient infrastructure
3. Provide eco-friendly alternatives in cafeterias
4. Create green spaces for recreation and education
5. Invite environmental experts for workshops and seminars

Conclusion

The PTA meeting successfully raised awareness about environmental pollution's impact on students and emphasized the need for collective action. The proposed strategies and action plan will be implemented to create a healthier, more sustainable environment for students, promoting their well-being and academic success.

Next Steps

1. Schedule a follow-up meeting to review progress
2. Establish a committee to oversee environmental initiatives
3. Invite parents, teachers and students to participate in environmental activities

The meeting concluded with a call to action for all attendees to contribute to a cleaner, greener future for the school community.

Curriculum Implications-

The Chairperson mentioned that curriculum reviews are conducted periodically to check on efficacy and impact of learning strategies. the process of review, keeping the possibility of the extended lockdown, screen time concerns, physical and mental wellbeing of the learners. The resolutions will be shared through the upcoming Beacon. And as for now every precaution is been taken while in school.

Closure Remarks:
